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#### **Importance of Attendance**

Attendance at monthly MYAC meetings is critical to the success of the Mayor's Youth Advisory Council and to ensure that each meeting has a reflective representation of the teen community in Ammon. Because enrollment is limited, attendance becomes even more important. Due to the importance of attendance, members are asked to sign a commitment form, acknowledging the following:

- Failure to attend and participate in meetings and events without notice in advance may result in immediate dismissal from MYAC.
- School activities are acceptable absence excuses. Members are required to notify the Secretary and inform of absence due to school activity. Failure to notify will result in an unexcused absence.
- Family emergencies are acceptable absence excuses, but verification by a parent may be requested.
- Maximum of three absences will be allowed before your membership in MYAC may be re-evaluated.
